Village of Rulo City Sales Tax
"Shall the governing body of the Village of Rulo, Nebraska, impose a sales and use tax at the rate of one percent (1.0%) upon the same transactions within the municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a sales and use tax?"

FOR said Sales and Use Tax.

AGAINST said Sales and Use Tax.

A VOTE FOR: If a majority of votes are cast in favor of the Sales and Use Tax, then the Chairman and the Village Board of the Village of Rulo shall be empowered to proceed to impose such tax and shall forthwith proceed to impose said tax pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act.

A VOTE AGAINST: If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such tax, then the governing body shall not impose the tax."

Initiative Measure 434
