


Richardson County, NE ARPA Funding Survey

The American Rescue Plan will deliver \$350 billion to state, local, and tribal governments to aid in recovery from the COVID-19 emergency. Richardson County, Nebraska will receive just over \$1.5 million as part of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program. These funds may be used for five broad categories of eligible activities:

Q1 Are you a resident of Richardson County, Nebraska?*



Q2 Did you or your family suffer adverse health consequences due to the COVID-19




Q3 Did you or your family suffer adverse economic consequences due to the COVID-19 health emergency?*


Q4 Do you own a business or work in Richardson County?*


Q5 Did your business or employer suffer adverse economic consequences due to the COVID-19 health emergency?*

- **-Public Infrastructure**: Examples of projects could include water, sewer, and broadband system expansions.
- **-Housing & Neighborhoods**: Examples of projects include affordable housing for the elderly, low-income families, homelessness, and the socially vulnerable.*
