RICHARDSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS NOVEMBER 29, 2023

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 29, 2023. Roll call was answered by Karas, Sickel and Caverzagie. The Invocation was given by Chairman Caverzagie and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Karas. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

Motion was made by Sickel to approve the minutes of the November 22, 2023, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Caverzagie. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Sickel-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Sickel to approve the agenda as posted. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Sickel-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried. ROAD DEPARTMENT

Steve Darveau, Jr., Highway Superintendent updated the Board on the routine road and bridge maintenance being done this past week.

Motion was made by Sickel to adopt Resolution 2023-2024-20 to authorize the Chairman to sign the year end certification of County Highway Superintendent for annual incentive payment for 2023. LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this past week. He reported that over the time period for the "Click It or Ticket" grant conducted from November 22 thru November 26 there were 187 traffic stops with 52 citations issued, 9 arrests made with 2 of those felons and 2 as a result of warrants issued.

Courthouse Roof

Other

It was reported that Schawang Masonry, LLC will begin the improvement project to the northeast area of the Courthouse lawn and parking lot on Thursday, December 7 and should be completed within 7-10 days. This improvement is being made to eliminate a water drainage problem in this area and leaking within the lower-level area of the Courthouse.
