RICHARDSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS JUNE 25, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 25, 2025. Roll call was answered by Karas, Campbell and Caverzagie. The Invocation was given by Chairman Caverzagie and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice-Chairman Karas. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

Motion was made by Karas to approve the minutes from the June 18, 2025, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Campbell. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Karas to approve the minutes of the Board of Equalization meeting from June 18, 2025. Motion seconded by Campbell. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the minutes of the Safety Committee Meeting on June 18, 2025. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE DEPARTMENT

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau, Jr. updated the Board on the routine maintenance being done on county roads and bridges this past week. He reported that he will be holding interviews for 2 positions to be filled in the Department and advertising to fill a vacancy for the office administrator.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement enter this week. Currently there are 9 inmates being held at the Jail. He reported that there are still some issues with the air conditioning not cooling certain areas of the Law Enforcement Center and it is being addressed.

A grant to compensate for overtime accrued by deputies for traffic speed enforcement during the period of July 14 through July 31 has been applied for through the Nebraska Department of Transportation.

Sheriff Hardesty reported that a deputy has been hired to fill a vacancy. The Board also reviewed further the requested proposed salary increases effective July 1, 2025, for the department staff with no action taken at this time. The Board indicated that they would continue the review of the request and finalize the decision after the budget has been reviewed.

Motion was made by Karas to approve the purchase of 2 patrol units, 2025 Ford Explorer police interceptors with selected options from Hullman's Ford Linc of Falls City from the state bid contract #16076 OC at a price of \$46,904 each. Motion seconded by Campbell. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

DISTRICT 1 CHIEF PROBATION OFFICER

Melanie Stormer, District 1 Chief Probation Officer reported to the Board statistical information on the probation office in Richardson County along with the proposed budget for the Nebraska State Probation District 1. Richardson County's portion of the costs for District 1 probation is \$10,666.68, a reduction of \$969.66 from the prior year.

SCOTT MILLER, MILLER-FARRELL INSURANCE

Scott Miller and Steve Simon representing Miller-Farrell Insurance Agency presented to the Board the county general liability, work comp, auto, property, error & omission, umbrella, etc. insurance changes and renewal premium information to the Board for the period of July 1,

2025 through June 30, 2026.

Motion was made by Caverzagie to accept the insurance changes and renewal premium for the coverage period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, with Miller-Farrell Insurance at a total of \$336,441.25, an increase of the prior year of 5%. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

COMMISSIONER KARAS

Commissioner Karas requested this time to review the current wages of the staff in the County Treasurer's Office. County Treasurer, Amanda Bartek-Ramsey was also in attendance for this meeting and requested that the Board consider an increase for the support staff in the County Treasurer's office to keep in line with other departments and other job opportunities in the area.

CORRESPONDENCE/OTHER

Recognition of County Officials and Employees Policy
