RICHARDSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AUGUST 13, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 13, 2025. Roll call was answered by Karas, Campbell and Caverzagie. The Invocation was given by Chairman Caverzagie and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice-Chairman Karas. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

Motion was made by Karas to approve the minutes from the August 6, 2025, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Campbell. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the minutes from the August 6, 2025, Board of Equalization meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karasaye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the agenda as posted. Motion seconded by Campbell. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried. The agenda is posted at the Richardson County Courthouse in the First Floor Lobby, the Lower-Level Lobby and on the Commissioner's Meeting Room door on the 2nd Floor and on the Richardson County website www.richardsoncountyne.gov.

COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE

Kaytlyn Kennedy, Extension Educator reviewed with the Board the FY2025-2026 proposed budget for the Cooperative Extension Service in Richardson County.

ROAD & BRDIGE DEPT.

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau updated the Board on the routine maintenance being done on county roads and bridges the past week. A discussion was held on the road conditions due to the recent rainfall in the past weeks. The Board also reviewed the proposed FY25-26 budget for the road department with Mr. Darveau.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this week. He reported that there are currently 18 inmates being held at the Jail. The Sheriff's Department was awarded a NE Dept. of Transportation grant "Drive Sober--Get Pulled Over" which will reimburse Richardson County for overtime that is incurred by the county's law enforcement officers during August 16 through September 3. He also once again reported tha the NE Jail Standards will be conducting the annual jail inspection on August 19.

The Board also continued the review of the FY25-26 proposed budgets for the Law Enforcement Center.

ROB TICHY, COUNTY SURVEYOR

Rob Tichy, County Surveyor reviewed the FY25-26 proposed budget with the Board.

REVIEW OF FLOODWAY/FLOODPLAIN AREA Application for Floodplain Variance

Brian Kirkendall, EMA Director, presented to the Board an application for a floodplain variance which was reviewed by the Board. The applicant is required to include a "no-rise certificate" which was not included with the application. No action was taken on this application. County Attorney, Samantha Scheitel was also available for this review.

A continued discussion was held regarding the ordinance of the floodway and possible changes that could be made to alleviate some of the current restrictions.

In researching the requirements to be met for any construction in a floodway in the neighboring state of Missouri, it was discovered that building in a floodway in Missouri is

permitted with certain guidelines as their state regulations and laws are written to allow it. Lance Braun from the Office of Nebraska District 1 State Senator, Bob Holstrom, was in attendance at this time and made note that their office will research the possibility of introducing legislation to change Nebraska's regulations.

The Board reviewed the July, 2025, monthly operating statement.

Liquor License Amendment
